## FINE WINE IN FINE SHAPE (JUDGING BY THE BARRELS)

Judging by a recent report by the Fédération des Tonneliers de France, demand for top-shelf French oak barrels was effectively sleady from 2013 through 2014. The organization's 51 member cooperages manufactured 524,500 barrels, accounting for sales of 342 million euros.

On a like-for-like basis, the market trend observed was toward stability in value and a slight 3% drop in volume. The slight drop in the number of units sold is the result of an increase in the use of larger banels and slower business in

the southern hemisphere and in China. Specifically, large format, supplied by 17 of the 51 member cooperages, is a growing segment, currently accounting for 7% of total sales.

Prench coopers continue to be recognized worldwide, as evident in 66% of their business going abroad. Top markets are focused in five countries that represent 80% of the world market: France (where a normal harvest has helped bring back stability), the United States (where growth has been good for the second year in a row), Australia, italy and Spain.



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
